Appropriate footwear can keep you safe from an accidental injury on the job.

The following is a guide to the most common types of PROTECTIVE FOOTWEAR and the types of hazards they protect against:

GUIDELINE – FOOT PROTECTION

- Be alert to potential hazards BEFORE an accident can happen
- Be alert to possible unguarded pinch points
- **STEEL-REINFORCED SAFETY SHOES** are designed to protect your feet from common machinery hazards such as falling or rolling objects, cuts and punctures.
 - The entire toe box and insole are reinforced with steel, and the instep is protected by steel, aluminum, or plastic materials.
 - Safety shoes also insulate against temperature extremes and may be equipped with special soles to guard against slip, chemical, and/or electrical hazards.
- **SAFETY BOOTS** needed depend on the specific hazards you face. Boots offer more protection when splash or spark hazards are present.

LOOK FOR THESE FEATURES:

- Slip resistant soles
- ANSI labels inside each sole
